The school prides itself on employing a remarkable faculty and staff. Not only are they experts in their fields, but they come to school each day with optimism and enthusiasm for education. The school hires and retains faculty members who are devoted to professional growth and welcome taking on new challenges.

In May 2024, BCD unveiled its new mission, vision and values. After conducting a comprehensive and inclusive community-wide process that identified the school's core strengths and areas of opportunity, the school is more excited then ever about its future.

This is a fantastic opportunity for a leader who finds purpose in Preschool-8th grade education at a well-established school in one of the most beautiful parts of the country.



THE PROGRAM

BCD's Preschool begins with children as young as 2-and-a-half years old. The experience is predicated on the belief that learning lives in the heart and mind. It centers on the core principles of teaching independence and interdependence, communication, inquiry, and healthy living and physical well being. In addition to the regular classroom curriculum and learning experiences, Boulder Country Day's preschool program incorporates a "Specials" curriculum that includes instruction in world language (French and Spanish), movement, music, and library. In addition, all children participate in regular cooking classes and the Pre-Kindergarten students also engage in art and STEM focused classes. The Specials curriculum helps to ensure that every preschool child begins to discover their excellence.

BCD's Elementary School fosters engagement, resilience and joyful learning in a challenging yet supportive environment. The commitment to small class sizes (maximum of 18) ensures that teachers truly know and meet the academic, social, and emotional needs of each student. The faculty pride themselves in being current with research-based instructional theory and practice. The Learning Center staff partners closely with elementary classroom teachers to support the diverse learning styles of the students by using a variety of grouping strategies for teaching math and language arts. The elementary school integrates *Responsive Classroom*, Kid Power and *Learning for Justice's Social Justice Standards* into each classroom to ensure a robust learning experience.

Elementary students participate in musical performances, plays, and assemblies held throughout the school year. Each student can expect to be on stage performing several times during the year. Each grade takes part in a musical performance where music teachers collaborate with homeroom teachers to prepare the events. Parents/Guardians are always welcome. BCD's Elementary School is a place of incredible discovery, connection, and joy.

In addition to the core subjects of language arts, mathematics, and social studies taught by the homeroom teacher, elementary students also receive instruction in <u>technology</u>, <u>art</u>, <u>science lab</u>, <u>library</u>, <u>physical education</u>, <u>music</u>, <u>band</u>, and <u>world language</u>. Students take both French and Spanish from Kindergarten through 5th grade. Students are introduced to Latin starting in 6th grade.

BCD's Middle School offers an innovative and engaging curriculum that balances meaningful inquiry into core academic subjects with in-depth pursuit of students' interests in the arts, physical and health education, and design/technology. The program presents students with age-appropriate challenges in a nurturing environment that cultivates independence of thought, habit, and mind.

BCD's Middle School program not only meets the diverse needs of its students during these critical middle years, but also provides excellent preparation for Advanced Placement and International Baccalaureate high school programs.

Knowing that the world needs well-rounded learners, the Middle School also invites students to explore competitive <u>athletics</u>, <u>leadership opportunities</u> such as student government, travel opportunities, and an expansive <u>Exploratories</u> curriculum featuring a wide array of electives to round out their development as citizens of our community and the world.

The Boulder Country Day Middle School is an authorized International Baccalaureate Middle Years Program. The IB Middle Years Program (MYP) emphasizes intellectual challenge and encourages students to make connections between their studies in traditional subjects and to the real world. The IB program fosters the development of skills for communication, intercultural understanding, and global engagement, qualities that are essential for life in the 21st century.

THE CAMPUS

Nestled in the Gunbarrel neighborhood of Boulder, BCD's 5.5 acre campus abuts Boulder County's <u>Twin Lakes</u> park, which is a haven for wetlands wildlife and crisscrossed by bike and pedestrian trails. The campus was designed with the specific needs of BCD's students in mind. Each division (<u>Preschool</u>, <u>Elementary</u>, and <u>Middle</u>) is housed in its own building, and the school constructed flexible common spaces knowing that children's needs change as they grow. A brand new Dining Commons was added to the campus in 2024 and will open during the 2024-2025 school year to serve healthy lunches to students, faculty, and staff. The Dining Commons also houses innovation and art studio spaces as well as an outdoor patio for community gatherings.


Boulder, CO is a premier city for recreation, art and culture. It is known as the perfect balance of urban and outdoor spaces, with Denver only 30 minutes away. Boulder is also home to the University of Colorado, Boulder, a well known research university with an undergraduate population of 32,000 students. In addition, Boulder is close to world class skiing, mountain biking and hiking trails.

Boulder Country Day School is a fully accredited member of and an active participant in the Association of Colorado Independent Schools (ACIS), holds an authorization from the International Baccalaureate Middle Years Programme (IM MYP), and is a member of The Colorado Diversity Network and (NAIS) the National Association of Independent Schools.


THE ADMINISTRATION

There are currently 12 members of the senior administrative team. Many of the members have long tenures at the school and bring both institutional knowledge, and well-developed skills. Each division has a director, and there is a part time (60%) CFO, a part time (80%) Business Manager, and a part time (50%) HR Director. The After School program generates revenue for the school and a new director was hired to leverage that program more effectively.

BOULDER COUNTRY DAY SCHOOL FINANCE AND ADVANCEMENT

BCD runs on a budget of approximately \$9.1 million. The school's finances are strong with approximately \$1.2 million in debt compared to the approximately \$6 million in reserves that is treated similarly to a board designated endowment. Additional debt will be incurred to fund the new Commons Building.

The annual fund raises approximately \$280K per year and is about 3% of the operating budget. 100% of the trustees contribute to the annual fund and the parent participation for last school year was 36%. Other fundraising events include an annual Gala, which netted \$100,000 in the spring of 2024. To date, the school has raised \$4.3 million towards the new \$10.9 million Commons Building. The school anticipates bringing the capital campaign to a swift and energetic conclusion prior to the building's opening in August. The school is taking on up to \$6.75 million in new debt at a rate of 4.62%. The final amount will be determined by the end of the capital campaign.

ADMISSION AND ENROLLMENT MANAGEMENT

Boulder Independent Schools regularly have a higher attrition rate than national averages. BCD averages an attrition rate of 18% of its students. Most students who leave attend one of the local public schools, though some matriculate at another independent school.

The school accepts approximately 89% of its applicants and enjoys a High yield (82% in 2023). However, the school age population in Boulder is getting smaller, and admission will be a major focus for the new Head of School. About 9% of tuition revenue goes to financial aid (including tuition remission) and approximately 15% of the student body receive financial aid. Twenty-two percent of the student body identifies as students of color.









THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF BCD

The thirteen member board of trustees consists mostly of current parents, with two alumni sitting on the board. The board is responsible for the integrity of the school, the standing and reputation built by its founders and those who have labored over the years. The board holds in trust the school's future as well as its present.

The Board has had a strong relationship with the Head of School since his appointment in 2013. The Trustees and the Head both describe a healthy division of strategic and operational decision making with the Board delegating appropriate authority to the Head of School.

The Board has several standing committees, including:

- The Executive Committee Chair, Vice Chair, Treasurer, and Secretary
- The Finance Committee
- The Development Committee
- The Committee on Trustees

The Strategic Planning Committee is an ad-hoc committee from 2022-23 and 2023-24 that may continue in 2024-25.

The Board, in partnership with the Head of School and the entire Boulder Country Day School community, has recently introduced a new Mission, Vision and set of Core Values.

FUTURE LEADERSHIP OF BOULDER COUNTRY DAY SCHOOL "BCD"

The Board of Trustees of Boulder Country Day School is conducting a national and international search to identify its next Head of School. To that end, and to assist them in clarifying the opportunities and challenges, Eric Temple and Joan Beauregard of Educators Collaborative received input from more than 100 individuals during their site visit and by means of an electronic survey. Those interviewed and surveyed included faculty, administrators, staff, parents/guardians, trustees, alumni and the student council. Based on this input and the impressions of the consultants, as well as input from the search committee, the following represents a summary of BCD's strengths and the challenges and opportunities it faces in the next three to five years, as well as the qualifications and attributes of the next Head of School.

Strengths of BCD

Boulder Country Day School is well-positioned for a leadership transition. The Head of School, John Suitor, will conclude 12 years of leading the school in the summer of 2025 so he can move "east" to be closer to his roots. The next Head will inherit a school with state-of the art facilities, a new mission and vision, a clearly articulated strategic plan, an engaged and highly collaborative Board of Trustees, and a wonderful group of students and community members.

Strengths of the School:

- A compelling and inspiring new mission, vision and core values that will drive decision making at the school.
- The close camaraderie among the staff coupled with the close knit community of the school.
- The small class sizes and the individual attention given to students.
- Attractive, well equipped and well maintained facilites.
- A deeply committed Board of Trustees who think strategically.
- A comprehensive, well rounded, joyful educational program.
- The school celebrates childhood, and is closely attuned to the developmental and learning needs of its students.
- Strong financial foundation and careful stewardship of its resources.

Opportunities and Challenges for Boulder Country Day School:

The next Head of BCD will face challenges that are common to many independent schools as well as some that are unique to BCD at this point in its history. The following will likely be the primary focus areas for the school and the next Head of School.

- Maximize the benefits of the Preschool to 8th grade to create an exemplary program across the continuum with a strong school identity.
- Assure that the School's commitment to academic excellence is aligned across all school programs and incorporates healthy social and emotional development.
- Continue with the commitment to diversity, equity and belonging and the work associated with that commitment.
- Clearly communicate with all constituents so they are informed and there is appropriate transparency around decision making.
- The next Head and the team will need to work with constituencies to give greater definition and clarity to BCD's value proposition to bolster enrollment and retention.
- Partner with the Board and the faculty to continue work on the implementation strategies of the new mission, vision and values.
- Work with the Board of Trustees, the administrators and the faculty and staff to enhance the culture of philanthropy and implement industry best practices for development.
- BCD has implemented a new leadership structure to broaden and diversify decision-making at the school. The next head will need to assess progress, iterate as appropriate, and continue to clarify understanding of employee roles and responsibilities.

Qualification and Attributes of the Next Head of School

The Board of Trustees seeks as the School's next leader an individual whose personal and professional attributes match BCD's culture and who will provide effective leadership in the coming years. To best serve BCD, the next Head of School will be someone who:

- Is a successful school leader and manager.
- Is skilled at recruiting, retaining, and supporting faculty and staff.
- Has deep knowledge of curriculum and pedagogy as well as significant classroom experience.
- Has strong financial and budgeting acumen accompanied by a commitment to fundraising.
- Is able to engage, inspire and motivate a community toward the fulfillment of the school's new mission, vision and values.
- Evidences an abundance of characteristics typically found in successful school leaders: present, approachable and responsive, courage with kindness, character above reproach, excellent verbal and written communication skills, relationship builder, data-informed decision-maker, lifelong learner, humility, a sense of humor and the ability to work collaboratively and productively with stakeholders to work through conflict and build consensus.
