
### A Thriving Christian School in an Idyllic Setting

## Celebrating 30 years of growth and success

SouthLake Christian Academy was founded in 1994 as a ministry of SouthLake Presbyterian (PCA) Church. The school started with just 23 students in grades K-3, and now enrolls 650 students in junior kindergarten through 12th grade.

SLCA's 30-acre campus and facilities have expanded over the years to accommodate the growth of its community. The well-maintained facilities include three academic buildings, a gymnasium, a field house (with weightlifting, classroom and training rooms), a baseball complex, a cross country course, and a turf athletic field for soccer, lacrosse and football. A new arts building is expected to be completed in 2025 and an additional turf field and track is currently in the design phase.

The Academy has recovered impressively following an embezzlement fraud discovered ten years ago. While deeply painful for the school and church, SLCA responded admirably by instituting stronger financial controls and spearheading impressive growth in both its enrollment and facilities. The past decade of success at the Academy provides strong evidence of its resilience and the loyalty of its community.

### **ACADEMICS**

SouthLake Christian emphasizes academic rigor utilizing a collegepreparatory, biblically-integrated curriculum. Through academic challenge, experiential learning, and extracurricular opportunities, students' minds are inspired and their creativity nurtured.

### A Steadfast Yet Innovative Learning Environment

The school promotes an engaging and exceptional learning environment through the use of curriculum, technology, and individual teaching methods. Of note is the fact that SouthLake Christian's faculty and staff members are deeply loyal to the school, with an average tenure of over 12 years at the school. While the faculty is known for its continuity, teachers continue to innovate instruction, curriculum and assessments, often using technology integration to enhance the students' depth of learning. Upon graduation, SLCA students are prepared to be successful in college and life, pursuing excellence in service of the school's mission.



### **Thoughtful Technology Integration**

Technology is incorporated into all classrooms at SLCA. Every classroom features cutting-edge touch screen flat panels or smart boards. Technology continues to expand throughout the campus and into the curricula with STEM and Explore, Productivity, and Media Labs. The Upper School operates on a 1:1 device program with students receiving a MacBook Air laptop to use for the duration of their time at SouthLake Christian.



### **LOWER SCHOOL**


### **Introducing Curious and Creative Young Minds to Active Learning**

A child's academic and spiritual journey at SouthLake Christian begins in the Lower School, which serves grades JK through 4. The outstanding reputation of the Lower School program is evidenced in its growing enrollment. Simply put, families understand the value of SLCA and are eager to enroll their children at a young age.

Lower School classes are limited to approximately 18 students, staffed with a teacher and full-time assistant. SLCA's Lower School is deeply committed to an early focus on academics and experiential learning. With encouragement and guidance from teachers, Junior Kindergarten students identify their areas of interest, follow their inquiry, and learn by doing. In Kindergarten, students continue to be supported in their open inquiry and independent thinking, an approach that fosters curiosity, openness to differing perspectives, and the desire to keep learning. Activities include launching boats that they constructed with their 3rd grade "buddies" and the end-of-year celebration, known as the Kindergarten Olympics. Additionally, every Kindergarten student is paired with a high school senior buddy who stays with them throughout the year, forging strong bonds that continue through their SouthLake experience.

For students in grades 1-4, SLCA focuses its program on traditional academic skill building while supplementing these studies with curriculum-focused nature walks, personal writing projects, and the creation of a conservation park on campus. Studies in math and problem-solving are reinforced with hands-on constructivist projects related to real-world scenarios. As part of their studies, students learn from experts, engage in cross-disciplinary projects and simulations, and take part in off-campus class trips to study specific topics out in the field.

Once a week, students attend Chapel services. A Biblical worldview is woven into the regular curriculum in addition to a daily Bible class. You can learn more about the Lower School program here.

#### MIDDLE SCHOOL

### An Environment that is Welcoming, Safe, Encouraging and Inspired

At SouthLake Christian Academy's Middle School, students are divided into two distinct groups — the Intermediate School (Grades 5 and 6) and the Junior High (Grades 7 and 8). At each grade level, the schedule, class structure, and curriculum are thoughtfully and intentionally designed to help students effectively transition from the self-contained classrooms of Lower School to the independent learning style required of a successful Upper School student. Students in the Intermediate School have fewer classes. and several structured breaks throughout their day including a 30-minute lunch and 30-minute recess. Once promoted into Junior High, the day includes more classes, more teachers, and more rigor while still allowing students the room to grow and mature into the learner God has uniquely designed them to be. ### **UPPER SCHOOL**

### A Sense of Purpose

SouthLake Christian's Upper School is purposefully designed to develop critical thinkers who learn with and from each other and their teachers. It is a place where students in grades 9-12 collaborate in intellectual, artistic, athletic, and entrepreneurial pursuits within a framework of inquiry and care.

SLCA offers 14 different AP courses, which students can begin to take during their junior year. In addition, the school offers a variety of innovative elective classes, including Forensics, the Philosophy of Film, Engineering, and Cybersecurity. As a Christian school, each teacher practices biblical integration of their subject matter in which they weave God's truth into their lessons organically to help students

better understand the nature and character of God. In addition, students take at least two years of religious study, and choose among courses that include Apologetics, Systematic Theology, and Christian Ethics.

The extracurricular life of an upper school student can be full and rich. Besides its arts and sports opportunities, SLCA offers a wide variety of clubs and organizations for students. The school's most robust club, Student Mission Fellowship, offers service opportunities, weekly Bible studies and social events. Leadership Council, the student government organization, offers participating students opportunities for growth. SLCA has grade-level Bible studies led by teachers, and clubs around specific interests such as the medical profession, Spanish, and robotics. ### SPECIALIZED ACADEMIC SUPPORT

Recognizing that SouthLake Christian Academy's program is rigorous, the school offers a wide variety of learning programs for students who need additional assistance. The school's academic development center provides Math and Language Enrichment Groups, a tutorial study hall, speech and occupational therapists, mental health counseling, and resources from the National Institute of Learning Development and the Search & Teach program. ### SERVING THE SPIRITUAL LIFE OF STUDENTS

As a Christian school, SouthLake Christian Academy serves the spiritual needs of its students throughout its program. The school aims to fulfill its mission to educate and disciple students while pursuing three main objectives. First, the school desires all of its students to have a growing and vibrant relationship with Christ, as well as a caring relationship with their parents, teachers, and peers. Second, the school seeks to develop in SLCA students a worldview that enables them to think Christianly, sifting all decisions through the grid of Scripture, thus inspiring the formation of inner convictions and values. Third, SCLA desires that its students develop a genuine and heartfelt attitude of service that results in living for God and living for others, realizing that the ultimate goal of God's grace is conformity to the image of Christ.

To meet these goals, SCLA prioritizes worship through weekly chapel meetings, emphasizes relationships and provides myriad opportunities for students to take part in local and global outreach. Upper School students enjoy an annual threeday Fall Retreat to Young Life's Windy Gap in Weaverville, North Carolina to foster relationships and build class camaraderie through class competitions, skits from student government, refreshing times of worship and challenging messages from a guest speaker. Students in grades 7 and 8 also attend a retreat at Windy Gap, engaging in outdoor activities, times of praise and worship, and a guest speaker. # ATHLETICS: WORK HARD, PLAY HARD, PRAY HARD

SouthLake Christian views athletics as a unique opportunity to teach self-discipline, teamwork, obedience, compassion, and Christ-like character on the field of competition. The athletic program seeks to develop these spiritual characteristics while also training the physical body in a competitive environment. SLCA teams have enjoyed success by winning five team state championships (NCISAA) and 20 individual state championships in baseball, cross country, football, swimming, volleyball and wrestling.

The Academy offers a broad range of athletic opportunities, and has enjoyed significant success in a range of programs. Eighteen student athletes from SCLA are currently participating on Division I, Division II, and Division III college sports teams in soccer, lacrosse, baseball, basketball, football, tennis, volleyball, and gymnastics.

The Academy's athletic facilities include a turf field (with an additional turf field in the planning stages), a field house, a baseball field, a cross country course and a fitness center — all added to the campus in the last ten years. ## PURSUING EXCELLENCE THROUGH THE ARTS

SouthLake Christian seeks to develop in each of its students an appreciation of the arts. To this end, art and music classes are an important part of the curriculum throughout all grades. Students attend both art and music classes each week in the Lower and Middle Schools, and perform in Christmas and end-of-the-year programs. In Upper School, students can choose from a variety of Fine Arts electives to meet their graduation requirements.

Upper school students can also be involved in the annual drama production, choir, orchestra, concert band, and ACSI Fine Arts competitions. Each year the Upper School drama production features musicals such as Disney's Beauty and the Beast, Bye Bye Birdie, The Wizard of Oz, Oklahoma!, Seussical, Sound of Music, and Peter Pan. SLCA's Upper School theater productions have garnered acclaim from the Blumenthal Performing Arts Center's Blumey Awards.

Middle and Upper School students perform at venues around the Charlotte area and compete in music festivals at Carowinds and the annual ACSI Fine Arts Festival. The school's plans for a new Arts Building are well underway, with a goal of completing this new complex in 2025. The addition of this facility clearly reflects the school's deep commitment to arts education.

The Board of Trustees of SouthLake Christian Academy is conducting a national search to identify its next Head of School. Search consultants Tracy Bennett and George Sanderson of Educators Collaborative solicited input from all stakeholders during on-campus visits and gathered additional input from stakeholders through an online survey. Based on this input, impressions of the consultants, and feedback from the Head of School Search Committee, the following represents a summary of the school's strengths, challenges and opportunities, and the skills and attributes desired in the next Head of School of SouthLake Christian Academy.

### **Strengths of The School**

- SouthLake Christian Academy has earned an excellent reputation in North Carolina and nationwide. It is well respected for its consistent commitment to Christian education, its strong academic programs, and emphasis on nurturing the character of its students.
- SouthLake Christian Academy's enrollment has grown considerably over the past ten years, with
  waiting lists for admission in many grades. The robust interest in SLCA affirms its outstanding
  reputation in the area and distinct identity.
- Families often say that they choose SouthLake because it retains the atmosphere of a small school, while offering the breadth and depth of program of a larger institution. The warmth of relationships among parents, teachers, and students is clear and powerful to visitors.
- The SouthLake Christian Academy community is impressively engaged in, and supportive of, the school. Parent volunteerism is strong and the well-functioning Board of Trustees is deeply committed and forward-thinking in its approach to governance.
- The faculty and staff at SouthLake Christian are deeply loyal to, and proud of, their school. Most teachers have served for over a decade and the retention of faculty is considered a strength.
- The leadership team at SouthLake Christian is experienced, highly competent, and professional. The school benefits from their knowledgeable perspective and close working relationships.
- SouthLake Christian Academy is located in a thriving, scenic area of North Carolina and the growth of this area supports the long-term sustainability of the school.
- SLCA continues to ensure that its program and community is responsive to, and relevant in, an ever-changing world while remaining steadfast in its dedication to its Christian mission.

### **Opportunities and Challenges**

Continue to recruit and retain mission-aligned, passionate, accomplished teachers, supporting their wellness and professional growth

Committed, talented faculty are at the heart of SouthLake Christian Academy and continuing to invest in their morale, growth, and development is key to successful teacher recruitment and retention. The next Head of School will lead the school's work in attracting and retaining quality educators committed to the mission of the school.

#### Maintain and cultivate the Christian mission of the school

A primary factor in families choosing SLCA for their children is the school's Christian identity. It will be important for the next Head of School to be clear about their commitment to Chrisitan theology and its central place in the ethos of the school in their communication and interactions with all members of the school community.





Thoughtfully explore the "right size" of SouthLake Christian Academy in light of its recent growth Since its founding 30 years ago, the enrollment at SLCA has grown significantly. Even after this growth, the school is in the enviable position of receiving more admission applications from qualified students than it can enroll. The next Head of School will have the opportunity to strategically consider the implications of this growth, with a sensitivity to the culture of the school and its facilities.

#### Develop the next Strategic Plan and a campus master plan

SLCA's considerable growth presents the next Head of School with an opportunity to strategically plan for the school's future. The existing space addresses the school's current programmatic needs, but students could be better served by additional and athletic facilities and the school's growth has produced the need for more classroom space. The next Head of School will provide the vision necessary to guide the Academy's future and implement priorities identified in the planning process.

#### Nurture the relationship with the Church

In late 2023, the Academy reached an agreement with SouthLake Church that separated the operations of the two entities. Notwithstanding this new arrangement, the Church remains integral to the success of the school and the next Head of School will need to continue to foster a positive, healthy working relationship between the two organizations.

### Partner with the Director of Advancement to strengthen SouthLake Christian Academy's long term fundraising capabilities

The future capital needs of SouthLake Christian will require raising additional funds from donors. The next Head of School will need to develop trusting relationships with potential donors and steward relationships with current parents and alumni, working closely with the Director of Advancement to build a deeper culture of philanthropy at the school.

#### Maintain the school's strong position in market

As the area around SLCA has grown, the educational landscape is evolving, with new school options for families opening up. It will be important for SouthLake and its next Head of School to be responsive to this additional competition in order to maintain its dominance among schools in the area while maintaining the school's strong sense of community, small school feel, and reasonable tuition.









Skills and Attributes of the Next Head of School
