Sunny Hollow is committed to being a thriving, authentic Montessori teaching and learning community that stands against racism and bias and exemplifies a culture of inclusivity and social justice.

History

Sunny Hollow Montessori was founded in 1981 by Mary Sue Dobbin, a Montessori teacher and early childhood advocate. The school's name comes from Mary Sue's childhood experience in her own backyard. As a blind child, she loved to spend time in a special spot where she would feel the sun on her face and felt safe and nurtured. She called that backyard place her "sunny hollow." She named her school for the same feelings of security and welcome she wanted for her students.

Sunny Hollow is celebrating nearly 40 years of serving children in the Twin Cities area. The school is a non-profit organization and is directed by a volunteer Board of Trustees. The school achieved Association Montessori Internationale (AMI) accreditation in 2005.

Originally founded as a Montessori preschool and kindergarten, Sunny Hollow now serves children ages 16 months through Junior High. There is one Toddler Community (ages 16 to 33 months), three classrooms for children ages 33 months to 6 years, two Lower Elementary classrooms for children ages 6 to 9, two Upper Elementary classrooms for children ages 9 to 12. In 2019, the school added a Junior High program that serves adolescents in grades 7 and 8 (ages 12 to 14).







Sunny Hollow Montessori Programs

Sunny Hollow offers authentic Montessori education for children ages 16 months to Junior High. Classrooms follow the international, high-quality standards of the Association Montessori Internationale (AMI).

Toddler Community

In a beautifully prepared environment, AMI-trained guides connect children to a learning experience that encourages exploration and purposeful activities. Furniture and learning materials are specifically crafted to suit the developmental needs of this age group, to support the intellectual, sensorial, social and physical development. The toddler community offers activities to promote independence, self-confidence and a positive attitude towards learning.

Casa | Preschool and Kindergarten

The Casa program provides children with a rich, multi-sensory environment and hands-on learning activities that honor children's developmental needs and help them become confident, responsible, independent learners. There are three classrooms, each with 24 to 28 students, a lead AMI guide (teacher), a trained assistant, and an aide.

Elementary

The Elementary program gives children a wealth of experiences, activities, and social connections that inspire and challenge students to be their best selves. There are two lower elementary (grades 1 to 3) classrooms and two upper elementary (grades 4 to 6) classroom, each with about 25 students, a lead AMI guide (teacher) and a trained assistant.

Junior High

The Junior High at Sunny Hollow provides a challenging and rewarding environment for young adolescents. The interdisciplinary curriculum engages students to solve meaningful problems and develop higher-order thinking skills. Through creative expression, community service, microeconomy, occupations, experiential learning trips, and physical expression, students explore their roles in community, find their voices, and strengthen their sense of belonging.

There is one Junior High community that offers mixed-aged classes for students in grades 7 and 8, with classes led by two guides who cover the range of academic subjects.









Before and After School Care

Sunny Hollow Montessori provides before and after school care options for currently enrolled students through the Extended Day programs. Care is available from 7:30 to 8:30 am and from 3:30 to 5:30 pm.
