important are the values that are being taught, the sense of pride that is instilled and the community culture that is nurtured. In Lower School, they work with children on understanding that their feelings are valid and that they have control over their body and their thinking. Character development centers on self-control, curiosity, and empathy through living Jewish Values: *emet* (truth), *tzedek* (justice), *chesed* (kindness), *kavod* (respect), *tikkun olam* (repairing the world), *k'lal yisrael* (community).

The goal in the Lower School is to develop independent learners who are eager to work hard to solve problems in order to further their knowledge of the way the world works. The faculty at TVT share a common belief that students are more engaged in the process of their own learning when the material is relevant and applicable to their everyday lives. Because technology has created immediate access to every type of information, faculty have turned their focus to teaching skills, such as strategies for problem-solving, that cannot be learned through technology. Teaching must include hands-on, individualized exploration of how to be successful in an ever-changing, technology-rich society.

TVT faculty members work to make the process of thinking through a problem more visible, so that students are able to approach a problem in a more systematic way. This allows students to discover new ways to express their ideas, and they can do so more concisely, articulately, and logically. When students know how to approach a difficult problem, they are able to apply this process to a variety of disciplines and situations. TVT Lower School students move onto middle school with unique skills that allow them to attack a difficult math problem confidently; step outside of a thorny social situation and view it from multiple perspectives; and independently arrive at innovative and creative solutions to the everyday problems they face as part of living in a complex world.





The Campus

The campus sits on 21.5 acres with state-of-the-art facilities that is child centered and inspires innovation and collaboration. Anyone who visits campus is moved by the energy, kindness and strong sense of community that is palpable in all parts of the school.

Earning the prestigious "Honor Award" from the American Institute of Architects, the spacious hillside campus provides:

- 150,000 square feet of state-of-the-art facilities
- The latest technology integrated into all classrooms
- Gymnasium and two full-size athletic fields
- A library with the largest collection of Jewish reference books and A/V materials in Orange County
- State-of-the-art digital film production studio on-site which complements our digital photography and film production courses

Irvine and Surrounding Areas:

Irvine, California is an exceptional place to live and work. With an annual average of 300 days of sunshine and America's largest urban open space network, Irvine offers excellent schools and universities, 360 miles of connected bike trails, the lowest crime rate of any large city in America, and over 800 community organizations. Within a half hour commute to TVT Community Day School are the beach communities of Costa Mesa and Newport Beach, among others. Situated one hour south of Los Angeles, and about an hour and half north of San Diego, Irvine offers easy access to all the perks of Southern California living from skiing in the winter to year-round surfing.

THE LOWER SCHOOL DIVISION HEAD POSITION SUMMARY



The Lower School Division Head serves as the chief administrator of the Lower School in developing and implementing policies, programs, curricula and budgets in a manner that promotes the educational development of each student and staff member in alignment with the School's mission and educational philosophy.

Essential Job Functions:

- Make meaningful impacts on student's lives by creating an innovative, positive and dynamic atmosphere conducive to learning.
- Be an advocate of diverse learning modalities to promote and enhance individual student strengths.
- Prepare and inspire faculty to instill in our students a love of learning and knowledge.
- Act as the educational leader of the Lower School, responsible for its day-to-day operation; direct the activities of the members of the school instructional and the non-instructional staff in the performance of their duties.
- Function as the chief articulator of the division's educational programs, expectations, and

behavioral guidelines.

- Through collaborative and respectful leadership skills, nurture a strong sense of community for students, parents and staff.
- Be an active, collaborative member of the Head of School Senior Leadership Team.
- Observe, supervise, and help evaluate the faculty in the development and implementation of curriculum; supervise the teaching process, and review and evaluate academic programs.
- Be a visible presence in all areas of the school; work toward a resolution of all problems - both routine and unique - as they arise; keep the Head of School informed of the general programs, activities, and challenges of the school.
- Be aware of the educational, physical, social, and psychological needs of the members of our school community and develop plans for meeting these needs.
- Oversee and direct the activities of the lead teachers, the sponsors of various student organizations and activities, and faculty committees. Make recommendations to the Head of School regarding the hiring and retention, and the assignment of faculty.
- Strive for unity, harmony, and cooperation through tact, helpfulness, respect, and a recognition of individual differences and the special abilities and strengths of each teacher.
- Conduct regular meetings with faculty which will deal both with routine school matters and with the stimulating exchange of ideas on issues of educational/philosophical interest and concern.



- Prepare a master school class schedule and assign teachers and students to classes and other obligations.
- Serve as a consultant to teachers in matters of classroom management, teaching methods, and general school procedures.
- Provide activities which facilitate the professional growth of the school staff and enhance the quality of the instructional program.
- Develop the annual objectives for the instructional, extracurricular and athletic programs of the school.
- Develop and manage an annual preliminary budget for review by the HOS and CFO/COO.
- Perform other duties as assigned by the Head of School.

Qualifications (preferred) and Desired Attributes:

- Bachelor's degree required, Master's degree preferred.
- Experience in school management with minimum 2 years of experience in school administration.
- Ability to maintain confidential, collaborative and positive working relationships with administrators, faculty, staff, parents, students, school and community organizations vendors and the general public.
- Interest in Working in a value driven pluralistic Jewish School.
- Takes initiative and is self-directed.
- Attention to detail and strong organizational and communication skills.
- Personal qualities of integrity, optimism, flexibility and humor.
