NEW HAMPTON SCHOOL Where Wonder & Well-Being Unite

Located in the Lakes Region of New Hampshire, New Hampton School is a 9-PG school celebrating over 200 years of education.

The New Hampton Academy was founded on September 17, 1821. The early days of the school were hosted in a two-story, twenty-four by thirty-two-foot building in the town center. No blackboards, few teaching tools, but determination and support from its community and people. The school has undergone several reinventions over the years, eventually renaming itself the New Hampton School in 1959. New Hampton School celebrated its 200th anniversary on September 17, 2021.

Setting

The school is nesteld in the foothills of the White Mountains, 30 miles north of Concord, New Hampshire, and near the cities of Boston, Massachusetts and Portland, Maine. The New Hampton campus boasts:

- Twelve residential houses,
- State of the art classrooms and science laboratories
- Three computer labs
- A research center
- A library

- Arts and athletics complex
- Photography labs
- Theater
- Studios for the arts (dance, music, and media production)

In addition NHS students enjoy a climbing wall, five athletics fields, nine tennis courts, a hockey rink, a ski and snowboard center, two ponds, and a 325-acre mountain for outdoor recreation.

ARTS

At New Hampton School, the arts are essential and exciting. ABOUT NEW HAMPTON, NEW HAMPSHIRE

New Hampton, located in Belknap County at an elevation of 531 feet, sits in central New Hampshire, about 2 hours north of **Boston and 45 minutes** north of Manchester. It has several lakes, including Jackson Pond, Lake Waukewan, Lake Winona, **Pemigewasset Lake** (public access), and Sky Pond (public access). The **Pemigewasset River forms** its western boundary, and the Ayer's Island electric plant is in town. With a population of 2,377 (2020 census), New Hampton is also known for winter sports and is home to **George Duncan State** Forest.




LEADERSHIP PROFILE

The Board of Trustees of New Hampton School is conducting a national and international search to identify its next Head of School. To that end, and to assist them in clarifying the opportunities and challenges ahead, Mary Seppala and Nat Conard of Educators Collaborative surveyed the school community and visited the campus for two days in February to collect input from members of the faculty, administrators, staff, parents/guardians, trustees, alumni and students. Based on this input and the impressions of the consultants, as well as input from the search committee and Board of Trustees, the following represents a summary of New Hampton's strengths and the challenges and opportunities it faces in the next three to five years, as well as the qualifications and attributes of the next Head of School.

Faculty, students, and staff alike describe the school as a welcoming, inclusive, and supportive environment where individuals feel a deep sense of belonging. Expanding arts programming, improving theater spaces, and integrating creative opportunities alongside sports will make NHS a more well-rounded and attractive option for students with diverse talents.

The next Head of School at New Hampton will be a visionary, motivational, self-aware, collaborative independent school leader with deep boarding school experience. In addition, they will:

- Be experienced and skilled at financial management and the critical revenue-generating aspects of independent school leadership, fundraising and enrollment management.
- Have demonstrated a strategic, innovative, and entrepreneurial mindset, and the ability to manage change and navigate conflict or adversity.
- Possess a strong track record of hiring, retaining, developing and nurturing talent throughout the faculty and staff.
- Be an active listener and an excellent communicator, skilled with the written word and an inspiring and engaging public speaker.
- Be honest and trustworthy, with strong personal integrity.
- Be friendly, warm, genuine and approachable—a true community builder.
